

Memphis to Gulf Coast Itinerary

Day 1

Depart Memphis for Tupelo (travel time: approx 1.5 hours)
Arrive Tupelo. Visit [Elvis Presley Birthplace and Museum](#) and Tupelo Hardware Store.
Travel to Oxford (travel time: approx. 1 hour)
Dinner, live music and overnight on Historic Town Square

Day 2

Driving tour of Oxford, including [University of Mississippi](#) campus, James Meredith Civil Rights Monument and William Faulker's [Rowan Oak](#)
Depart Oxford for Clarksdale (travel time: approx. 1 hour)
Lunch and tour of Clarksdale, including [Delta Blues Museum](#), Crossroads, Riverside Hotel and [Mississippi Blues Trail](#) markers.
Depart Clarksdale for Indianola (travel time: approx 1 hour)
Arrive Indianola. Visit [BB King Museum and Delta Interpretive Center](#).
Depart Indianola for Greenwood (travel time: approx 30 minutes)
Arrive Greenwood for "Cooking to the Blues" [Viking Cooking School](#) class
Overnight in Greenwood

Day 3

Driving tour of Greenwood including Robert Johnson gravesite, [Viking Range Corporation](#), and Mississippi Blues Trail sites.
Depart Greenwood for Vicksburg (travel time: approx 2 hours)
Arrive Vicksburg. Visit historic homes, Vicksburg National Military Park and get a great look at the Mississippi River
Depart Vicksburg for Natchez (travel time: approx 1.5 hours)
Dinner and overnight in antebellum home in Natchez

Day 4

Tour of Natchez including antebellum homes, Natchez-Under-the-Hill and Natchez in Historic Photographs at the Stratton Chapel Gallery
Depart Natchez for Mississippi Gulf Coast (travel time: approx 3.5 hours)

Day 5 (Times to be determined based on attractions selected)

Enjoy an excursion aboard the [Biloxi Shrimp Trip](#). For 90 minutes, enjoy tales of shrimping, fishing and Biloxi history.
Cross the street to see the new [Hurricane Katrina Memorial](#) built by *Extreme Makeover: Home Edition* on the Biloxi Town Green.
Spend some time at the [Ohr-O'Keefe Museum of Art](#) to experience the creations of George Ohr, our very own "Mad Potter". You can try your hand at some pottery creations of your own or watch an artist at work at the potter's wheel. Don't miss the [Pleasant Reed Interpretive Center](#) on the property of the new Ohr-O'Keefe Museum site, a replica of the original house that former slave Pleasant Reed built in 1887. This home exemplifies not only architectural but historical significance to the coast.

Cruise the coastal highway to discover our new [tree sculptures](#), created by regional woodcarvers. Trees destroyed by the hurricane have been given new life as works of art.

Visit [Beauvoir](#), The Jefferson Davis Home circa 1852, reopened June 3, 2008. This property was the stunning home of the President of the Confederacy and the place where he penned his memoirs. The estate, fronting the Gulf of Mexico, was also the site of the Mississippi Confederate Soldier's home which cared for hundreds of veterans and their wives.

After dark enjoy the shows, entertainers and gaming at our coastal casinos.

Day 6

Travel east to [Old Town Ocean Springs](#). Spend the morning visiting the many boutiques, galleries and restaurants of this quaint artisan town. Don't miss a visit to the [Walter Anderson Museum of Art](#) to enjoy the distinctive works of this renowned artist.

If the waters of the Gulf of Mexico are beckoning to you, relax on a sail aboard the [Biloxi Schooners](#), replicas of the oyster schooners used from the late 1800's to the early 1900's.

Venture out to the Gulf of Mexico with [Ship Island Excursions](#) aboard the *Pan American Clipper*. Docked at the Gulfport Harbor, watch for dolphins while you cruise to Ship Island, home of Ft. Massachusetts and some of our most beautiful beaches.

Day 7

Spend the day in the [Bay St. Louis](#). After a beautiful Gulf View drive west, you will cross the Bay of St. Louis into a shopping and dining paradise. Mississippi's West Coast is home to more than 200 resident artists who create fine and folk pieces exhibited in galleries that will take your breath away. Visit St. Rose de Lima, an African American based Catholic Church which holds a truly magnificent surprise! While riding through this historic town, you will see quaint shotgun homes dressed in pastels and gingerbread trim, and see firsthand their post-Katrina rebirth. The historic L & N Train Depot, new home to the Hancock County's CVB, is a convenient rest and information stop. Shop, shop, shop in designer boutiques, galleries, specialty and garden shops, book stores and bakeries. Dining is a treat at the local coffee shops and eateries.

If you're intrigued by outer space, blast off to [StennisSphere](#) and discover why America comes to NASA's Stennis Space Center prior to going into space. Before you begin your journey into space, you will be taken to the Launch Pad to prepare for your mission then on to a narrated tour through the nation's largest rocket test complex where space shuttles' main engines are tested. At StennisSphere, you will see exciting displays, exhibits, and unique presentations designed to educate and entertain.
